Director's Note

Nothing, but really nothing, can prepare you for directing a full-scale musical with a cast of around 40 and a production team of around 50. One always assumes that given enough careful planning, a lot of talking beforehand and just a bit of luck, everything will sort itself out. Wrong! Directing a show of this size requires more than just a bit of luck, it requires great big dollops of it, oodles of goodwill and immeasurable patience from all concerned – and that's on top of the careful planning, organising and talking.

However, there are some good surprises too. One of them was that the two of us worked so well together. Somehow we had the same vision, the same modus operandi and each others support when things inevitably started to get tough. I don't know how many times we got the knowing smirk from other directors "Oh yes, you're OK now, but just wait until rehearsals start". We waited and are still waiting...

The other surprise was the children. Our youngest cast member is only 8 years old, the eldest is 13 yet we have rarely seen such dedication, commitment and hard work. We could fool ourselves into thinking that it's us, but we know better. Their commitment has been without equal and we thank them for that. We're sure you will appreciate their talent and enjoy their performance on stage today.

Just one more thing before we sign off. Everyone in this show gives up a lot of their spare time. Although one tends to say that it's "only panto", we have both attempted to make it a little more theatrical and therefore the work that had to be put in by principal, chorus member, and backstage crew has also been increased. We hope we were in some measure successful so you really enjoy this post-Christmas traditional pantomime. We certainly have.

On behalf of the cast and crew and ourselves we wish you all a healthy and prosperous 1998.

Karim first appeared in on the Luxembourg stage in Hickoway Dickoway Dock (1991) as a wicked Wizard. He managed to give the younger members of the audience nightmares for weeks afterwards. He next appearance was in the panto Dick Whittington (1992) in which he played King Rat (typecast of course). To make up for the lack of nightmares in that show, he then played Macduff in Macbeth (1993), which even gave the adults nightmares. There was, however a bonus in that he was allowed to wear a ninja turtle outfit for a good part of the production. He then took to cross dressing like a duck to water and played a Greek soldier in a mini dress in a production of A Phoenix too Frequent (1993). He then quit acting for a while much to the relief of the Luxembourg audience and directed the Monkeys Paw(1995) by W.W.Jacobs and Same Time Next Year (1996) by Bernard Slade. Just as everyone thought it was safe to get back into a theatre seat, he appeared on stage in Easy production's Beyond Therapy (1996) as Bruce. He has served both on Pirates committee and, more recently on the New World committee. You will probably be able to spot him somewhere in the audience tonight wearing a silly hat and biting his nails. Give him a valium if you see him.

Brian was kidnapped from the safety of the George and Dragon Pub in October 95 and made to appear in the Pirates musical *Fiddler on the Roof*. Surprisingly enough he wasn't booed off stage and subsequently decided he rather liked it all. Several Pirates shows later he foolishly agreed to co-direct this pantomime extravaganza. Hopefully you'll all enjoy it and maybe he'll do it again!!


