











Once again I am delighted to write the foreword for what I am sure will be another stupendously successful Pirate production!

Culture takes many forms and I think we can all agree that Luxembourg has plenty to offer. Government at national and local level are, it seems to me, immensely supportive of the arts, including financially, and communes large and small often have impressive facilities for cultural events and offer richly diverse programmes. And, being Luxembourg, theatre and other language-based culture is available not only in the three official languages of the country but in many other languages too, including English. It is also no surprise, given how international Luxembourg's population is, that orchestras, chamber ensembles, theatre and dance groups, jazz, folk and rock bands, authors, artists and performers from every genre and from all over the world come to Luxembourg to entertain us. In short, we're pretty spoilt.

I am particularly pleased that it is possible to see so much British or UK-based talent here in Luxembourg. This year, for example the Philharmonie's programme includes concerts by the London Symphony Orchestra and the London Philharmonic Orchestra. Last Summer the Grand Theatre ended its season with triumphant performances of Akram Khan's Giselle by the English National Opera. This year the Grand Theatre's programme includes performances by Akram Khan himself and his Company, Sadlers Wells productions, and of course Cabaret directed by the National Theatre's Rufus Norris. I remember one balmy Saturday last July when you could have gone to hear Trinity College Choir Cambridge singing at the Cathedral and then walked across to the Kinnekswiss to listen to Sir Bryn Terfel. British bands are frequent visitors to Den Atelier, Rockhal and other venues around the country – earlier this year I even managed to get to see the Specials, one of my favourite bands from my teenage years. British artists are regularly shown at Mudam and other galleries in the City and elsewhere. You will all have your own memories of occasions in the last year when you have seen British or UK-based performers here, or tickets that you have bought or plan to buy for performances in 2020. Whether the UK leaves the European Union with or without a deal – and at the time of writing this in mid-October that was still unclear – I am confident both that the UK will continue to attract talent from the EU, as it does from around the world, to its travelling orchestras, theatre and dance groups, and that the rich programme of cultural exchange I have outlined above will continue.

As well as enjoying visiting international performers in Luxembourg we are also spoilt in the amount of local talent that is around, including English-speaking performers and artists. Pirate Productions are of course a brilliant example of this, entertaining us annually with top quality pre-Christmas shows. From the title I assume *Melusina the Pantomime* offers us a local storyline to one of the great entertainment traditions of the English-speaking world. What could be better. So sit back and enjoy!

The legend of Melusina is such a well-known story in Luxembourg, and in other parts of Europe, that perhaps it was only a question of time before a Brit decided to turn the legend into a pantomime with all the traditions associated with British panto – the cross-dressing where the leading comedienne is a man, the leading boy is a girl, lots of silly (and sometimes painful) jokes, well-known songs which have been modified to fit the plot and villagers dancing their little socks off! As with several previous productions, the last of which was *Young Frankenstein*, *Melusina the Pantomime* is a co-production with Kinneksbond and we would like to thank everyone: Jérôme Konen, Sam Weisenfeld, Virginie Magis, Ronnie Calimlim, Thierry Pratt and Sabine Sabotic for making us feel so welcome and for all the support they give us every time we come to put on a large production.

It is seven years since Pirate Productions put on their last pantomime and we are delighted to be offering a show that specifically has children in mind — even if many of them are in their 60s and 70s! It is also the first time we've performed a pantomime at Kinneksbond, giving us a great opportunity to offer, once again, this uniquely British form of entertainment here in Luxembourg.

Rachel Parker - Director

It's quite a few years ago since I first became involved in musical theatre with Pirates back in the I990s. Among the parts I was lucky enough to play was a lead was a Principal Boy in a pantomime and I will never forget coming out on that stage and seeing the reaction of the audience, and especially the children to this very special form of theatre.



As my involvement in musical theatre went on, I developed an interest in both writing and directing, including some training courses. I started with combining the two in the show 'Lost in the Stars' in 2017, which was small but very satisfying to me as a chance to tell the story of my favourite composer Kurt Weill.

It seemed natural to try my hand at a pantomime next. It was actually in reading about the various legends of Luxembourg that it came to me that a lot of the tales and characters would lend themselves really well to a pantomime. Melusina, as the most famous legend seemed ideal as the main story, but as I researched a bit deeper, I found all sorts of other interesting tales and characters that I have tried to incorporate. I also wanted to bring in some Luxembourg traditions. I will let you discover which ones during the show!

It's been a challenging but fun process bringing the show to life. I started with my own ideas, the team added to these, and then we all began working out how to turn them into reality. I have a newfound admiration for the creative skills, organisation and sheer hard work involved in a show like this. The cast all threw themselves into the process, ably coping with many long rehearsals with perseverance and good humour.

Pirates is an international group, and though we happily include Luxembourgers both on stage and in the creative team, we are mostly foreigners. So, the show is a celebration of Luxembourg and its history but told in our own way i.e. with a lot of theatrical silliness!

I hope you all enjoy the results of our hard work.





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Eric Gherardi - Musical director

After I started playing music at the age of eight, it became clear very soon that music would be a very important part of my life. Indeed, after finishing school, I went abroad to study orchestral percussion and music teaching in Maastricht (NL). I started playing as a drummer for Pirate Productions when I was still studying percussion in the Netherlands. It was the show called *The Jazz Club* that brought me to the Pirates family and I have been working together with these



wonderful people ever since. I have done a few more shows as a drummer and percussionist and I had the honour to be assistant musical director in the productions of Oliver! and Harlem Hotel. A couple of years ago, a dream then finally became true and I was asked to be the musical director for Scrooge! The musical.

I work as a percussion teacher for the Conservatoire in Luxembourg city, and I conduct the Harmonie Municipale in Schifflange, my hometown. I love working on musical projects of all sorts, with my orchestra and with Pirate Productions, and I am happy to be back as a musical director for our current show *Melusina the Pantomime*. This one is very special for me because the director gave me the opportunity to write the arrangements for the songs we are using myself, and even compose some original music for the show. It has been a fantastic and very interesting project as I could learn a lot about the traditional British pantomime, a genre which (I must admit) I only discovered because of this show. But as we worked on the project, I kept discovering more and more fun things you can do in a pantomime and that artistic freedom makes this genre a great opportunity to try out new ideas. A perfect playground for me!

So here I am, in the orchestra pit with a fantastic band, playing music that I have written for them, hopefully making everybody in the theatre enjoy the show as much as we do.

Dominique Vitali - Choreographer

I started dancing at the age of nine after seeing a World Championship on TV. Today I know that had there been a stage school anywhere in or around Luxembourg, that's probably the path I would have chosen. There wasn't, so dancing it would be! The bullying and name calling did nothing to change that, the passion was stronger and at the age of 19 (decades before *Billy Elliot*) I turned professional and opened my own dance school in Metz. At 34, after becoming French



professional champion in Latin-American Show dance and European finalist I decided to call it a day, grateful that I was able to fulfill my childhood dream.

I have danced both as an amateur and a professional with a focus on ballroom and Latin-American dancing. Having also trained in ballet, historical dances, tap dance and flamenco, I kind of have a general knowledge that comes in handy when it gets to staging choreography for musicals playing in various periods of history and with casts of mixed dancing skills. To me, nothing compares to the feeling you get when you see a show coming together and that moment the orchestra plays the overture on opening night! This probably explains why after Cinderella, Stepping Out, Showtime, La Cage aux Folles, Thoroughly Modern Millie, Nunsense, Scrooge the Musical, and Young Frankenstein, Melusina the Pantomime is my tenth production with Pirate Productions as a choreographer.


Neil Johnston - Assistant director

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




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






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Principals (in order of appearance)



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
